NOTE: There are 3 options in the B.S. in Agricultural Economics degree: (1) Agribusiness Management & Food Marketing, (2) Agricultural Economics and (3) Advanced Studies in Agricultural Economics. Students who choose the Agribusiness Management & Food Marketing option will complete a minor in Business Administration (AN 300, FIN 300, MKT 300 & MGT 301) which will also complete 12 hours of the additional 15 hours required in Specialty Support. Students who choose the Agricultural Economics option or Advanced Studies in AEC option will choose courses in consultation with their advisor to complete the Specialty Support requirement. Students may only take one of the following for 3 hours of their additional 300 level AEC courses: AEC 324 or AEC 325 or AEC 326.
